# A Word from Interim Director of Missions / Moderator Barry

Spiritual testing! When we are tested spiritually, it may come in many forms and fashions. Often, we can see the most evident testing, but we miss the most subdued ones. It is in that subdued testing time that we fail to understand what God is trying to teach us. Too often we've become open to our self-taught teaching that is sometimes called the World Teaching. This type of world openness allows Satan to come in and start to take over. I'm reminded that Jesus once told His disciples about the yeast and bread. Using yeast as a symbol of sin, He said just a little bit in the bread, ruined the whole loaf. Just like that, a little bit of sin in your life can ruin your life, or at least put you off track for a while. I believe many of us are facing those minor trials of Spiritual Testing – those events in our life where we're not listening to what God is trying to say to us and teach us! Because of that, I believe many of us are off the spiritual track. Our spiritual walk is not as strong as it should be. Our faith is often tested and we are found to be weak.

And then there's those overwhelming times of spiritual testing. You know, the kind that just absolutely hits you in the face. A devastating event, where all of a sudden everything around you comes to a stop. Nothing else matters. It's in these times we often hear ourselves crying out and saying, "Why Lord? Why? Why now?" not understanding that there's something very important that God wants to teach us. This is when we need to truly let go of everything that is holding us back from trusting God, and cry out with a sincere heart, asking, "Teach me, Lord! Show me, even more hold me!" We must be ready to receive that teaching and whatever else He desires to show us. We must be ready to accept what God has for us, and to know that He has a much better outcome and desire for us. But, until we are ready, we will not fully understand all His Love and compassion.

Our week of revival meetings was an absolute blessing. We had a very good turnout at each church each night. And the messages were just what we all needed to hear. My heart's prayer is that we will take what was given to us through the Word and apply it to our hearts and lives, and allow revival to start afresh in each one of us. And then, let that fire of revival spread throughout our community always remembering that as an Association we are "Doing together what we cannot do alone for the glory of Jesus Christ."
